Sub: Movement of ODCs/OWCs on various National Highways without permission of this Ministry.

Sir,

Due to exponential growth in basic infrastructure, it is observed that the movement of ODC/OWCs has increased manifold. As per CMV rules 1989 maximum gross vehicle weight of 49 MT on articulated tractor trailer combination (3 axle tractor with a 3 axle trailer) is allowed, loads beyond this are to be transported over modular hydraulic trailers under Ministry's permission maintaining the per axle loads within permissible limits.

In order to safeguard structural assets on National Highways (bridges and structures) and to have a better track of movements of ODCs/OWCs, Ministry has circulated guidelines vide letter of even No. dated 24-01-2013 for safe movement of ODCs/OWCs on National Highways after condition survey of bridges enroute. During the various meetings in the Ministry under the chairmanship of Secretary, RT&H, the representatives of Hydraulic Trailors Owners Association, Bharat Heavy Electrical Ltd. and representatives of various power projects companies, it has been given to understand that around 200 ODC/OWC are supposed to move along

National Highways every month. All the ODCs/OWCs are required to take permission for their movement by the Ministry after submitting Condition Survey of the National Highway bridges enroute through Ministry's empanelled consultants and permissible loads.

However, even after framing the guidelines for movement permission, Ministry has received only few requests from the transporters for permission. It appears that ODC/OWC's transportation are being undertaken by transporters without seeking permission from Ministry, thereby endangering the bridges enroute on National Highways. This illegal movement of ODCs/OWCs can be stopped with the joint efforts of transporters, consignors/consignee and NH Authorities. Ministry look forward for support from all agencies forming part of such movements.

In order to ensure safety of bridges on National Highways and smooth movement of the traffic, strict adherence to the Ministry guidelines of even No. dated 24-01-2013 is mandatory.

It is therefore, requested to intimate all concerned to follow the Ministry guidelines. Also authorities may device strict panel action against the persons/officials violating the Ministry's Guidelines.
