Sub: - Motor vehicles Department - Checking of overloading of Motor Vehicle stringent action - reg.

Ref:- Letter No.RT-16031/05/2010-T dated 06.07.10 of Government of India.

Vide reference cited the Central Government have directed to take stringent and sincere efforts to curb the practice of overloading.

As per section 114 of the Motor Vehicle Act, 1988, in case a vehicle is found to be overloaded, the excess load needs to be off- loaded at the cost of the driver/owner of the vehicle in addition to penalty under section 194 and compounding fee under section 200 before allowing the vehicle to proceed further. In this regard it is also informed that the Hon'ble Supreme Court have upheld this provision in WP(C) 136/2003 (Shri Paramjit Bhasin and others Vs. UOI & others) and made it clear that the excess load in case of overloading has to be necessarily off-loaded before allowing further movement of the vehicle. It may be noted that the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court has to be adhered strictly in its true sense.

In the letter the Central Government have noticed that inspite of clear-cut provision in the Motor vehicles Act, 1988 the instances of overloading are being reported from time to time. The Central Government remind that in addition to being one of the major causes in increasing the number of road accidents, overloading causes significant damage to the roads and incur huge expenses on exchequer to maintain roads.

In these circumstances, you are directed to implement the provisions regarding overloading in the Motor vehicles Act 1988 and comply with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court and the Central Government in this regard.
