C I R C U L A R

Sub:- Motor Vehicles Department - Enforcement of Rule 115(7)
of Central Motor Vehicles Rules 1989 - Reg.

Sub Rule 7 of the Rule 115 of the Central Motor Vehicles Rules 1989 stipulates that every Motor Vehicle after the expiry of a period of one year from the date on which the Motor Vehicle was first registered shall carry a valid Pollution Under Control Certificate (PUC) issued by an agency authorised for this purpose by the State Government. The validity of the Certificate shall be for a period of six months from the date of issue. The Certificate shall always be carried in the vehicle and produced on demand by an officer not below the rank of a Sub-Inspector of Police or the Inspector of Motor Vehicles Dept.

It is noticed that majority of Government vehicles are not complying with this provision. Since Motor Vehicle Department has decided to take stringent action against the violation of Emission standard, all Heads of Department/Chief Executives of Public Sector Undertakings are directed to ensure that the Pollution Under Control Certificate in original is available with the vehicles under their control, all the time. The driver of the vehicle shall be responsible for obtaining and keeping custody of the Pollution Under Control Certificate.

The Heads of Departments and Chief Executives are requested to communicate these instructions to the Officers under their control for immediate compliance.
