The General Secretary, Kerala AMVI's Association have represented to modify the Circular No.21/98 issued by the Transport Commissioner, Thiruvananthapuram regarding the inspection of vehicles involved in accidents and request to restore the position prior to the issue of the said circular. The matter was examined and the following directions issued.

As per Rule 352 of the KMV Rules, Magistrates, Officers of the Motor Vehicle Department not below the rank of AMVI and Police Officers not below the rank of Sub Inspector of Police are authorised to inspect any Motor vehicles involved in accident. Accordingly all the Officers authorised under rule 352 of the KMV Rule to inspect the vehicles involved in road accidents will examine the vehicle and issue necessary certificate as and when they are required to do so by the Investigating Officers.


