GUIDE LINES FOR THE SETTING UP OF EMISSION STATIONS IN THE STATE

Testing stations for the issue of pollution under control certificate.

1. Testing of motor vehicle and issuing "Pollution under control" Certificate, as provided under rule 115 (7) of the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989 shall be done by a testing station authorised by the State Government for the purpose under a license issued by the regional transport officer. The validity of the certificate shall be for a period of six months.
2. A testing station set up for testing petrol driven vehicle only shall have at least one gas analyser. A testing station intended solely for diesel driven vehicle shall possess at least one smoke meter. In the case of testing station set up for testing both petrol and Diesel driven vehicle, it shall possess at least one gas analyser and one smoke meter.
3. The person conducting the emission test in a testing station shall have the following qualification:-
 - (i) C.S.L.C. or equivalent.
 - (ii) National Trade Certificate in Mechanic (Diesel) or Mechanical (I.V.)

or

One year experience in a Government approved workshop

4. The testing station shall have minimum space for parking two light motor vehicles.

5. The application for the licence for conducting emission test for petrol/diesel/both petrol and diesel driven vehicle shall be made to the Regional Transport Officer concerned in form ETSA in duplicate.
6. The Regional Transport Officer on satisfying the the requirements specified in paras 2,3 and 4 above shall intimate the applicant to remit the licence fee of Rs.1000/- in any office of the Motor Vehicles department and produce the receipt thereof to the Regional Transport Officer.
7. On receipt of proof of remittance of the Regional Transport Officer shall issue the licence in form ETSL to the applicant for conducting the Testing Station.
8. The Regional Transport Officer, may after ~~xxx~~ giving an opportunity of hearing to the licensee may by order either suspend the license temporarily or revoke it, if he has reason to believe that the reading of emission tests are faulty or the tests are not being carried out in accordance with the provisions of the Act or the rules thereunder or the licensee fails to comply with any general instructions issued by the Government/Transport Commissioner.
9. The Regional Transport Officer may if necessary seek the advice of the Technical Adviser attached to the Office of the Transport Commissioner on technical matters.

10. Duties of the Licensee

The licensee-

...3...

- (i) Shall display the license, the standards prescribed for pollutants and normal working hours of the testing station at a prominent place in the premises of the testing station.
- (ii) Shall not alter the place of business specified in the licence without the prior approval of the Regional Transport Officer.
- (iii) Keep the premises open during the working hours for inspection by an officer not below the rank of Motor Vehicles Inspector or any other officer authorised in this behalf and afford such facilities as are reasonable for inspection by such officers.

3. Appeals

1. Any person aggrieved by an order of the Regional Transport Officer under para 7 may, within 30 days from the date of receipt of the order, appeal to the Deputy Transport Commissioner of the concerned Zone, who shall dispose of the appeal after giving the appellants an opportunity for being heard.
2. Any person aggrieved by the order of the Deputy Transport Commissioner under para-10 may within 30 days from the date of receipt of such order prefer a revision petition before the Transport Commissioner and the Regional Transport Commissioner may after giving notice to the petitioner dispose

of such revision petition within a period of 2 months from receipt of the date of such petition.

D. Issue of Certificate

1. The licensee shall conduct the emission test and issue the 'Pollution under control' Certificate with six months validity in the Form WTSC.

(a) on the request of the vehicle owner

(b) when the vehicle is being directed under rule.

116(1) of Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989.

The name and designation of the directing authority and the number and date of the request shall be noted in the certificate.

2. The Licensee shall prepare the certificate in duplicate. The certificate shall be arranged in the form of books containing 100 continuously machine numbered certificates.

3. The Licensee shall issue one copy of the 'Pollution under control' certificate, to the driver or the person in charge or control of the vehicle after obtaining acknowledgement for the same and the duplicate copy shall be retained by the Station as office copy.

4. The Licensee shall levy a fee for the conduct of the emission test as specified below on issuing a receipt therefore:-

(a) the test being carried out, under rule 116(1)

Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989 or at the request of the owner or a person in charge of a vehicle for a certificate in form ETSC.

Class of vehicle	Fee
Two wheelers	Rs. 25/-
Three wheelers including Autorickshaw	Rs. 25/-
Light Motor Vehicles	Rs. 40/-
Medium Motor Vehicles	Rs. 50/-
Heavy Motor vehicles	Rs. 50/-

The fee shall include the charges for minor adjustments of the carburettor in the case of petrol driven vehicles.

(b) in case where the Pollution under control certificate cannot be issued for want of compliance of emission standards or when the certificate in Form ETSC is not insisted by the owner or the person in charge of the vehicle, the licensee shall intimate the person in charge of the vehicle emission test results in writing after levying the fee specified below:-

Two wheelers	Rs. 10/-
Three wheelers including Auto-rickshaw	Rs. 10/-

Medium Motor Vehicles	Rs. 20/-
Heavy Motor Vehicles	Rs. 20/-

E. Directing the vehicle to the testing Station by the competent officer as contemplated in Rule-116(1) of Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989 shall be in the Form TSN.

Instructions to the applicants for the grant of licence in the setting up of the testing station for the conduct of emission test in diesel and petrol driven vehicles:-

The guidelines have been issued as per G.O. (MS) No. 02/93/MS, dated 24.6.93.

The testing stations should satisfy the requirements with regard to space, equipments and employment of qualified personnel as specified in paras 2, 3 and 4 of the guide lines.

The equipments shall be of a type specified in Rule 116(3) of Central Motor Vehicles Rules 1989. It has also to be ensured that the equipments has not been developed by the agency from whom the approval has been obtained. The copy of the approval certificate of the equipment and the declaration from the manufacturer/supplier to the effect that the equipment has not been developed by the agency from whom approval has been obtained should also be enclosed with the application form. Procurement of equipments which ~~xx~~ does not fully satisfy the rules and guidelines ~~x~~ issued in this regard may result in rejection of the application for the grant of license. Hence the applicants are requested to ensure that only approved equipments are procured. They may approach the Transport Commissioner to clarify any doubts in this regard.

As per the guidelines, the testing station should have minimum space for parking two light motor vehicles. It should be ensured that there is enough width at the entry to allow the passage of a heavy vehicle.

As per para (3) of the guidelines the emission test should be conducted only by a person having the qualifications prescribed therein. The copies of certificates to prove qualification should also be accompanied along with the application form. The applicants should see that all the requirements are met and necessary details are entered in the application form.

Testing of vehicular exhaust shall be started only after obtaining the license from the Transport Commissioner.

Pollution Control Certificates shall be printed only after obtaining the Licence from the Transport Commissioner.
