ORDER

In the Government order read as first paper above sanction was accorded inter alia for the formation of 5 Mobile Enforcement Squads with Head quarters at Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Kochi, Trichur and Kozhikode with the following staff pattern.

Motor Vehicles Inspector	: 1
Assistant Motor Vehicles Inspector	: 2
Driver	: 1

In the Government order read as 2nd paper above Government have also accorded sanction for the creation of the Temporary posts for being deployed in the above Mobile Enforcement Squads.

In the letter read as 3rd paper above, the Transport Commissioner has forwarded a proposal for the creation of 13 Mobile Enforcement Squads with creation of 13 Numbers of Motor Vehicles Inspectors, 26 Numbers of Assistant Motor Vehicles Inspectors and 13 Numbers of Drivers in the Motor Vehicles Department. He has stated that there has been appreciable increase in the number of road accidents over the years. 2792 people have been killed on the roads in Kerala in the year 2002 as compared to 2674 in 2001. The number of injured is around 50 thousand per year. As per the available statistics, Kerala with comparatively lesser length of roads and lesser number of vehicles, ranks 3rd in the number of accidents reported. The increasing number of deaths on the road has been of great concern. For enforcement of laws on road safety and also for increased revenue collection, one Mobile Enforcement Squad has to be set up under each territorial Regional Transport Office and also one to be attached for the Transport Commissionerate. There are 17 Territorial Regional Transport offices and 5 existing Mobile Enforcement Squads. The Mobile enforcement Squads in addition to enforcing the laws on Motor Vehicles can be pressed with service for collection of taxes and for bringing to book the tax evaders. Therefore, the Transport Commissioner has stressed the need for the formation of 13 Mobile Enforcement Squads.

Government have examined the matter in detail and are pleased to accord sanction for the formation 13(thirteen) Mobile Enforcement Squads with immediate effect, with the following staff pattern, for each of the Mobile Enforcement Squad avoiding appointment of Drivers, as Assistant Motor Vehicle Inspectors and competent to drive the vehicle.

Motor Vehicle Inspector : 1 Number  
Assistant Motor Vehicle Inspectors : 2 Numbers.

One Mobile Enforcement Squad is to be attached to the Transport Commissionerate and one Mobile Enforcement Squad under each Territorial Regional Transport Office except at Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Kochi, Trichur and Kozhikode.

Government are also pleased to accord sanction for the creation of the following temporary posts for the above 13 Mobile Enforcement Squads.

Motor Vehicle Inspectors on Rs. 6,500-10,550 - 13 Numbers  
Assistant Motor Vehicle Inspectors on Rs. 4600-7125 - 26 Numbers.

The Transport Commissioner will follow New Service procedure for meeting the expenditure for the above Mobile Enforcement Squads.
